B. Fabrication PTA's

Equipment expenditure types should <u>never</u> be used on a fabrication PTA. Use the Supplies Allocable expenditure type instead. All fabrication PTA's are exempt from overhead regardless of the expenditure type used.

C. Under \$5,000

Except on very limited circumstances, items under \$5,000 do not meet the definition of equipment. In general, the Supplies Allocable expenditure type should be used. The only exception is if an item is an upgrade to a current item of equipment that either extends the useful life of the equipment for 2 or more years or significantly adds to the benefit the equipment can yield. The tag number of the piece of equipment that is being upgraded MUST be referenced on the purchase requisition.
